**These activities need to be completed each week.**

**Maths and Times Tables.**

Please keep an eye out on the class page on the website. I shall be adding some useful websites to support Maths learning and times tables. Badgers really do need to be secure with their times tables please.

**Reading**

The Badgers will be coming home with a reading record book. Can you please encourage the Badgers to read at home independently and to read at least once a week with an adult at home?

**Spellings.**

Make sure you learn your spellings each week ready for a test at the end of the week. Spelling words will use a mixture of spelling rule words and words taken from the Year 5/6 National Curriculum.

**Choose on one of these homework activities each week. (You do not need to complete them all. Just choose one piece to do each week)**



**History:** Create a timeline of key events in the Benin Kingdom's history.

- Start from its origins (around the 11th century) and include major milestones like the reign of powerful Obas, the creation of bronze artworks, and contact with Europeans.

**An idea of your own!**




**Geography:** Draw a map

showing where the Benin Kingdom was located in West Africa.



- Label modern-day countries (e.g., Nigeria) and major rivers.
- Add a short paragraph explaining why the location was good for trade and defence.

**English:** Write a diary entry from the perspective of a child living in the Benin Kingdom during its height (around the 16th century).




- Include details about daily life, family, and what you see in the city (e.g., the Oba's palace, bronze plaques, markets).
- Encourage use of descriptive language and emotions to make it vivid.

**Science:** Local Habitat Survey.

Can you observe the living things in our local environment? Explore the local habitat.

- List 5 living things you can see.
- Group them into plants, animals or fungi.
- Can you explain how it gets food and how it stays safe?



**Art:**

Design your own Benin-style plaque or mask.

- Research traditional Benin bronze plaques and masks for inspiration.
- Use paper, foil, or clay to create patterns and symbols that reflect Benin culture.

**Spellings.** Please find below spelling lists for the whole term. You may cut them up, stick them on the fridge- whatever works for you. If your child struggles with spelling. We suggest choosing **three to five** spellings to learn and for the other words, discuss together their meaning and orally putting the words into sentences to support building a bank of vocabulary to recall. **Spelling Tests will be a Friday afternoon.**
