## What have the Otters been up to this week?

- This week in Maths we have continued to explore dividing up to 3 digit numbers by a 1 digit number. The children have even been completing questions where there is a remainder.
- In English, we have explored the settings of our story and come up with nouns, adjectives, adverbs and verbs to describe them. Also we have looked at expanded noun phrases and similes.
- In Science, we explored whether all plants need the same things to grow. We learnt that they don't necessarily zooming in on spider and snake plants that need very little light and water to thrive. We also planted our own seeds and are crossing our fingers that a plant will grow.
