What have the Badgers been up to this week?



- The Badgers are really enjoying our class text called 'The children of the Benin Kingdom'. This week we have created some character profiles, discussed character emotions, made our own predictions and also planned out the start of a diary entry writing in role. We have also completed so reading comprehension this week.
- In Maths our focus has been on decimals - looking mainly at the place value of decimals and being able to represent them in different ways. In Arithmetic we have revisited long multiplication and adding/subtracting fractions.
- In Spanish we started learning about 'Parts of the body'.
- For our RE lesson this week we thought about who Jesus is to Christians. We learnt about incarnation and the belief that Jesus is God in human form. The children created their own acrostic poems to reflect our understanding.

Our core concept this term is: **Perception and Empathy**

In Art this week we looked at some examples of Benin Art and the patterns we find as a part of West African Culture. It was great to hear what the Badgers thought. We created some mood boards to reflect our understanding and our likes from the art we had looked at.

Our history learning this week was about the events leading to the beginning of the slave trade in Benin. The Badgers had to show great empathy in this lesson.
